Commodity Market Update

Scrap values for non-fiber (plastic, glass, aluminum, and metals) remain stable.

Scrap pricing for Mix Paper (MP) and Cardboard (OCC) are down slightly as a result of port issues which impact all MRFs in CA. Shipping lines have reduced their schedules and imposed higher rates, so the cost of transporting recovered fiber to SE Asia has increased. Some MRFs have substantial onsite storage capacity for thousands of tons of recovered fiber, but the Shoreway facility has limited capacity and as such product is being shipped to SE Asia at higher-than-normal freight rates.

The combination of reduced schedules and port issues requires that SBR continue with some temporary stacking of MP and OCC in the portion of the parking lot which is assigned and permitted for such use. In general, there is between 150-300 tons of recovered fiber on site in the outside storage area.

In November the port of Oakland continued to have serious disruptions, and many steamship lines either did not visit the port or refused to accept export cargo. There were only a few steamship lines with service to destination ports receiving mixed paper. As a result the transport costs for MP in November was higher and the export transaction prices for MP was lower than reported in the index. That is why the market price for MP was slightly below the price assurance index. There is no local demand for MP. Nevertheless, SBR was able to continue and move product off site, which must be done due to limited storage capacity on site.

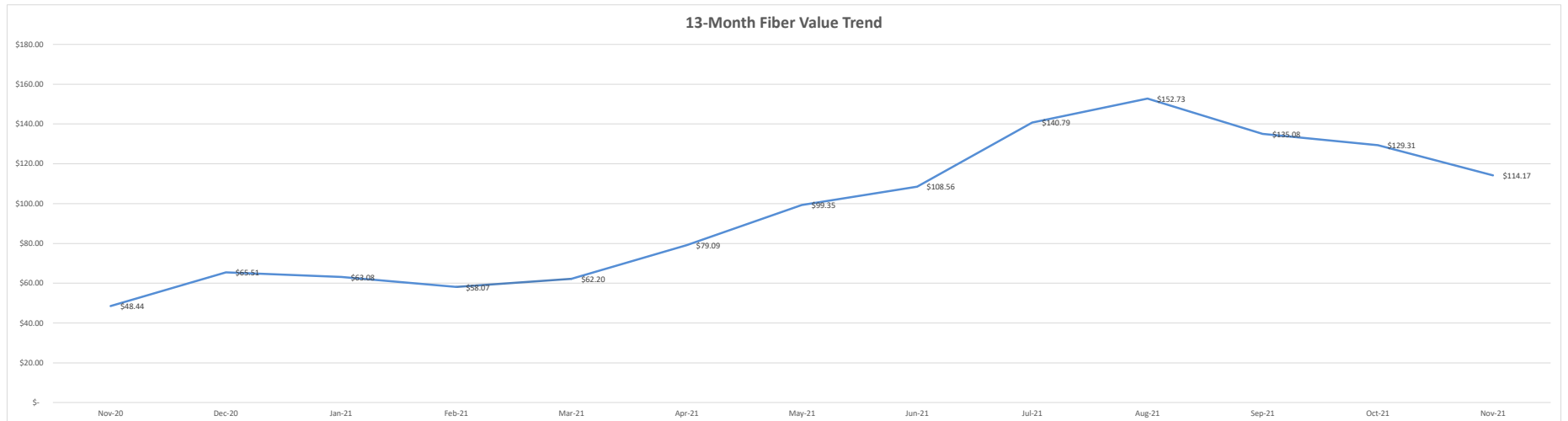
