Tonnage Allocations – During Quarter 4, system tonnage allocations were updated as follows: effective October 8 for usual and customary service changes. Bulky item collection tonnage is allocated based on the number of collection events for solid waste and on the basis of the number of items collected for recyclables. The allocation methodology is applied consistently each month.

Introduction

The Public Education and Recycling Technical Assistance Plan Status Report follows the three-year (2024-2026) Public Education and Recycling Plan as specified in section 7.03B of the Amended and Restated Franchise Agreement between Recology San Mateo County (Recology) and each of the RethinkWaste Member Agencies. This Report showcases Recology San Mateo County's team of Waste Zero Specialists (Recology Waste Zero) that provide high quality customer service and technical assistance through targeted outreach and resource distribution to Commercial and Multi-Family Dwelling (MFD) customers within the RethinkWaste service area. The Report outlines the strategy and approach of Recology Waste Zero to support improved customer diversion rates and achieve full compliance and participation in State-mandated organics and recycling collection programs.

Recology Waste Zero supports the success of the recycle, compost, and solid waste programs through comprehensive education and outreach and assists Member Agencies to meet State diversion mandates. Through outreach and education efforts, Recology Waste Zero helps drive clean recoverable materials to the Shoreway Environmental Center by implementing new recycling and compost programs, and inspire lasting behavior change among customers. The following is a summary of the technical assistance activities Recology Waste Zero conducted for the commercial sector and beyond during **October - December 2025**.

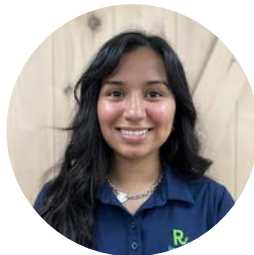

State Compliance: Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383)

Recology Waste Zero continues to focus on supporting Member Agencies in meeting the requirements of progressive organics recovery legislation, California’s Short-Lived Climate Pollutant Reduction Strategy, Senate Bill (SB) 1383. Recology Waste Zero provides technical assistance to commercial businesses and multi-family dwellings in implementing organics collection programs, providing recommendations through waiver reviews, and conducting annual route reviews.

Recology maintains an [SB 1383-specific webpage](#) that features an overview of acceptable materials in the compost program, tips for reducing waste, videos on the composting process, and additional tools to help educate customers on the environmental value of composting.

Organics Implementation

In Q4 2025, Recology Waste Zero brought **60** new accounts into SB 1383 compliance by starting organics collection programs. Of those, **36** were Commercial accounts and **24** were Multi-Family Dwellings. Recology Waste Zero also partnered with RethinkWaste and Member Agencies to create and distribute Notice of Violation (NOV) letters for non-compliant accounts. This quarter, a total of **187** NOV letters were sent to noncompliant accounts in County of San Mateo, Menlo Park, and North Fair Oaks. Recology Waste Zero also achieved **100% compliance** in both Commercial and Multi-Family Dwelling sectors in West Bay Sanitary District this quarter.

Figure 2. NOV Letters Distributed in Q4 2025

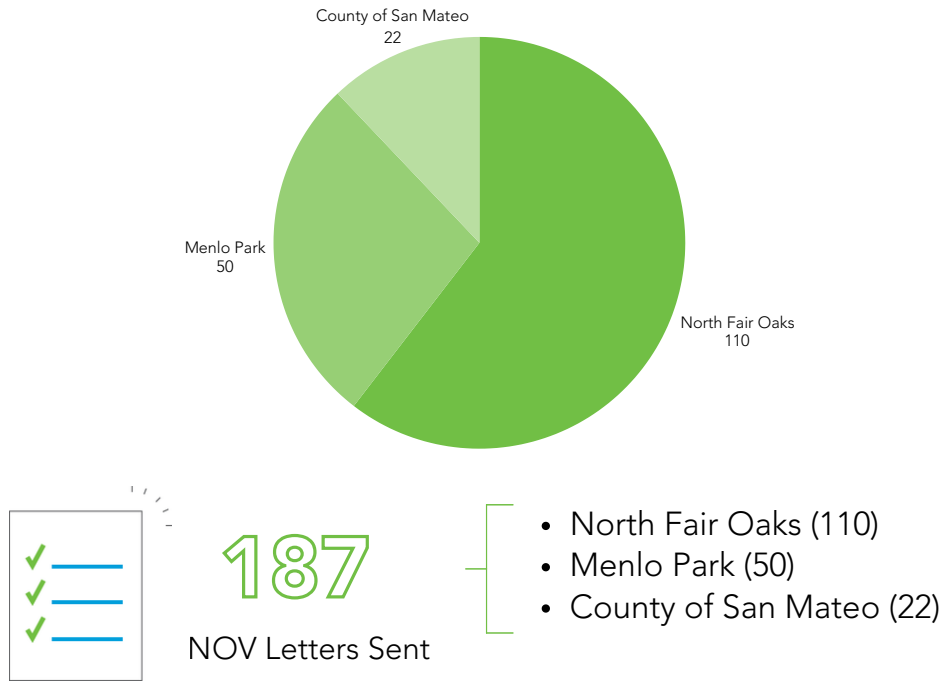


Figure 3. RethinkWaste Service Area SB 1383 Compliance Percentage by Member Agency

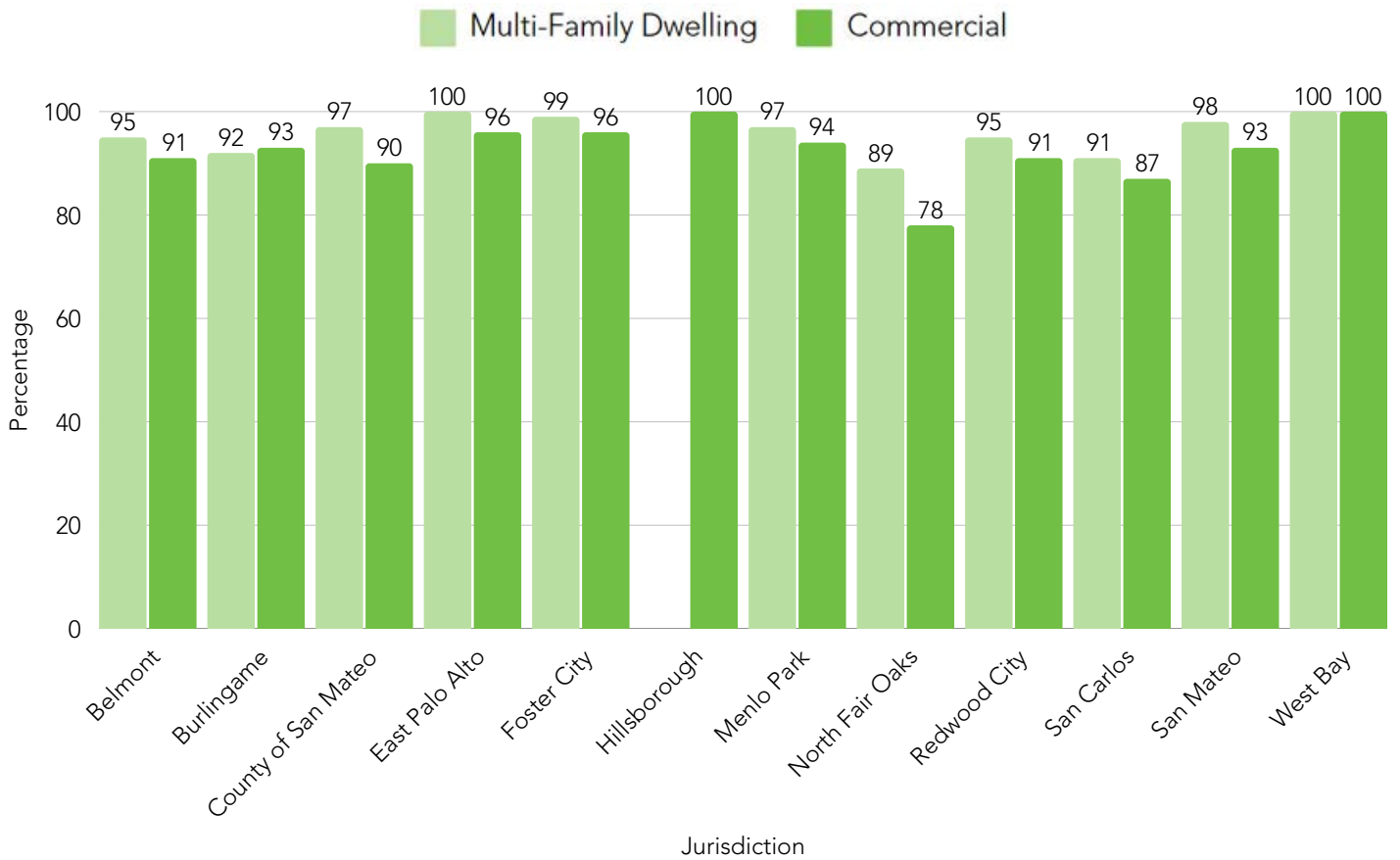


Figure 4. RethinkWaste Service Area SB 1383 Compliant Accounts by Member Agency

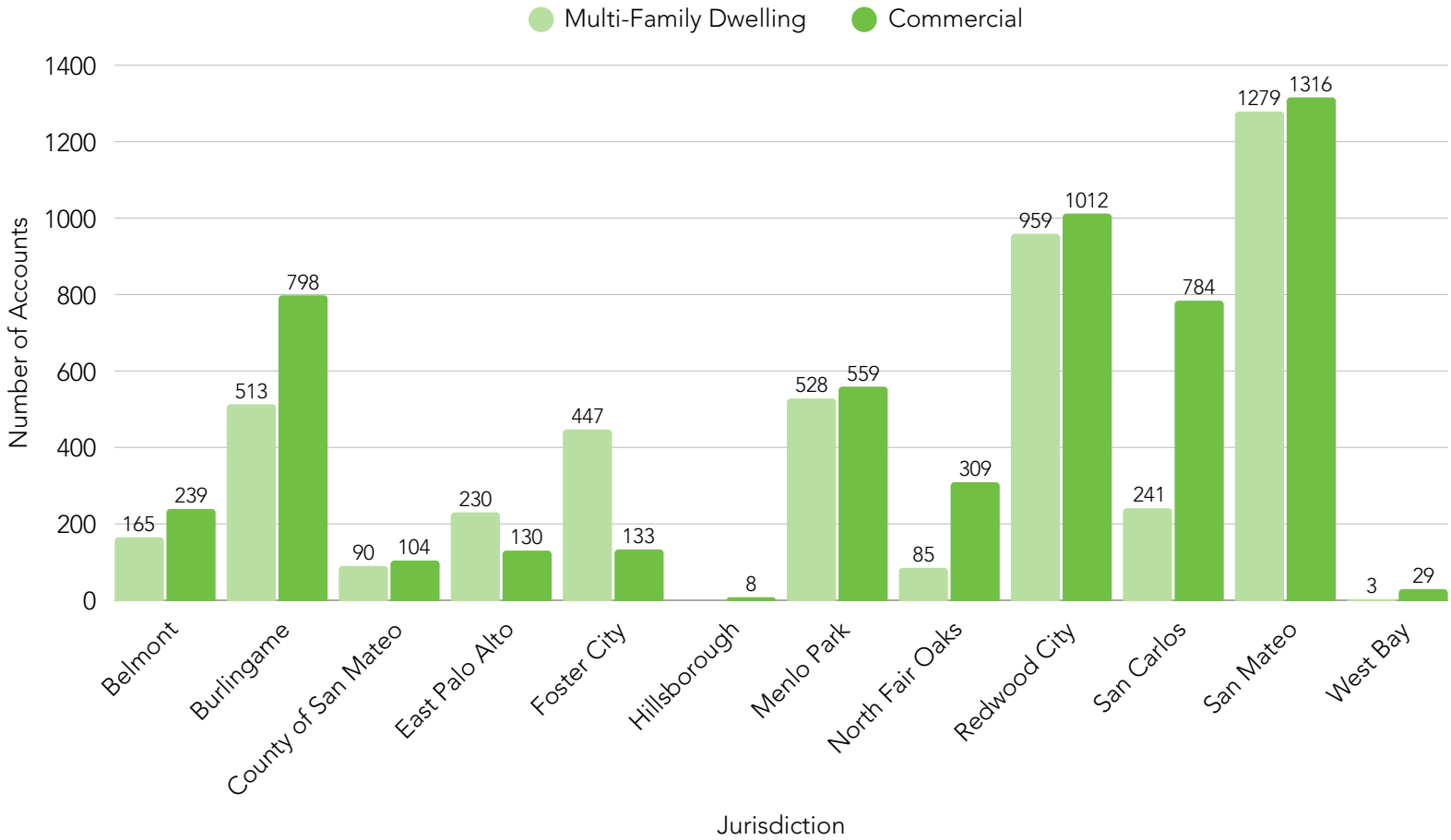
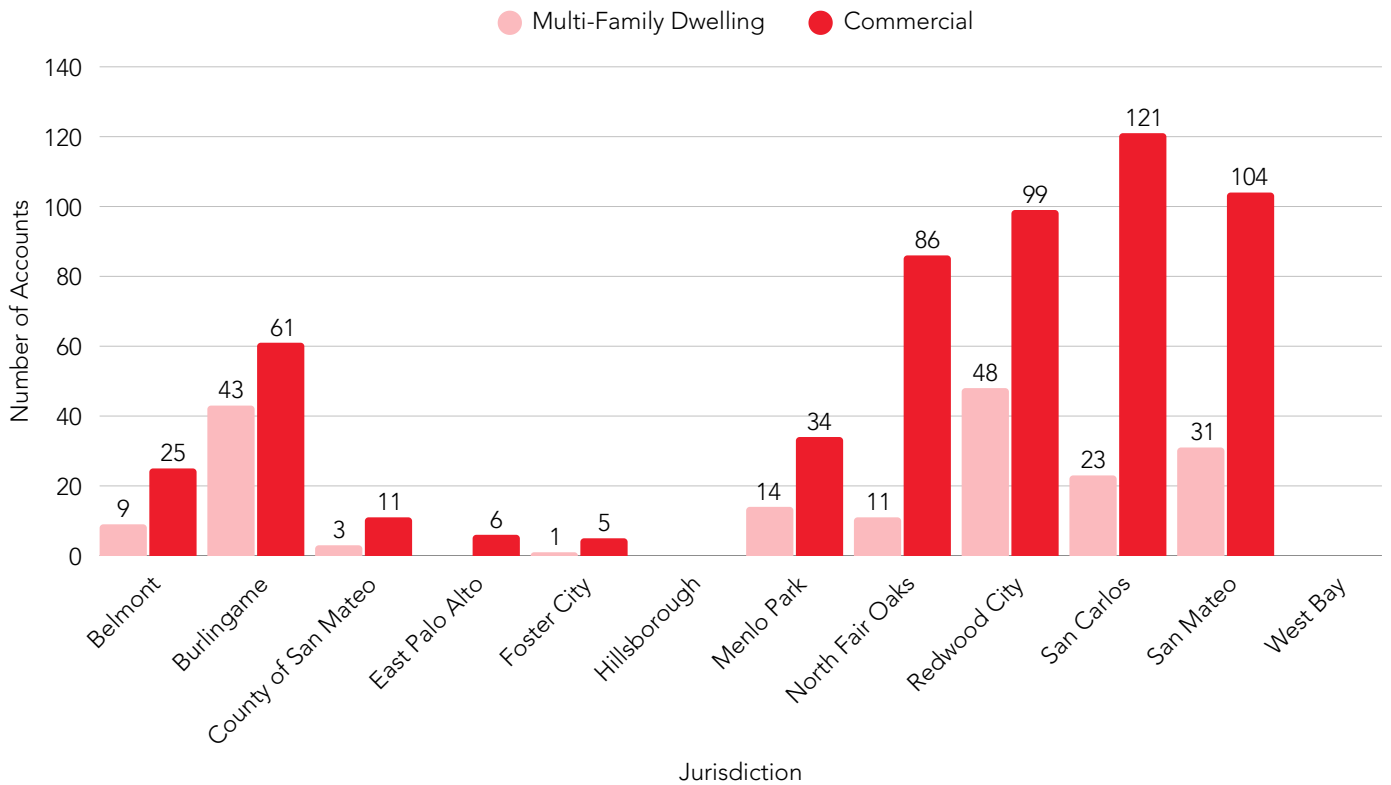


Figure 5. RethinkWaste Service Area SB 1383 Remaining Noncompliant by Member Agency



Multi-Family Dwelling Organics Implementation

In Q4 2025, Recology Waste Zero brought **24** Multi-Family Dwellings into SB 1383 compliance. Outreach to the MFD sector typically requires repeated and various outreach attempts to connect with an appropriate decision-maker, such as a property management company, property owner, or HOA Board of Directors. Working in the MFD sector includes on-site inspections, phone calls, audits, and the delivery of outreach materials. Once organics implementation is in place, Recology Waste Zero provides ongoing technical assistance directly to the MFD sector through door-to-door outreach of public education to encourage resident participation.

Door-to-door outreach includes providing each unit with an SB 1383 doorhanger that introduces the organics program, details SB 1383 legislation, provides information on proper sorting, and has a promotional offer to receive a free kitchen pail for interested residents. The doorhanger also includes a QR code where residents can view the video “Learn How to Compost” demonstrating steps on how to compost in their homes.

Recology Waste Zero hand delivered a total of **313** Recycling Buddy Bags, **423** kitchen pails, and **355** SB 1383 doorhangers in Q4 2025. The tables beginning on page 47 display the breakdown of Commercial and MFD outreach and educational materials distributed throughout the service area.

SB 1383 Waiver Reviews

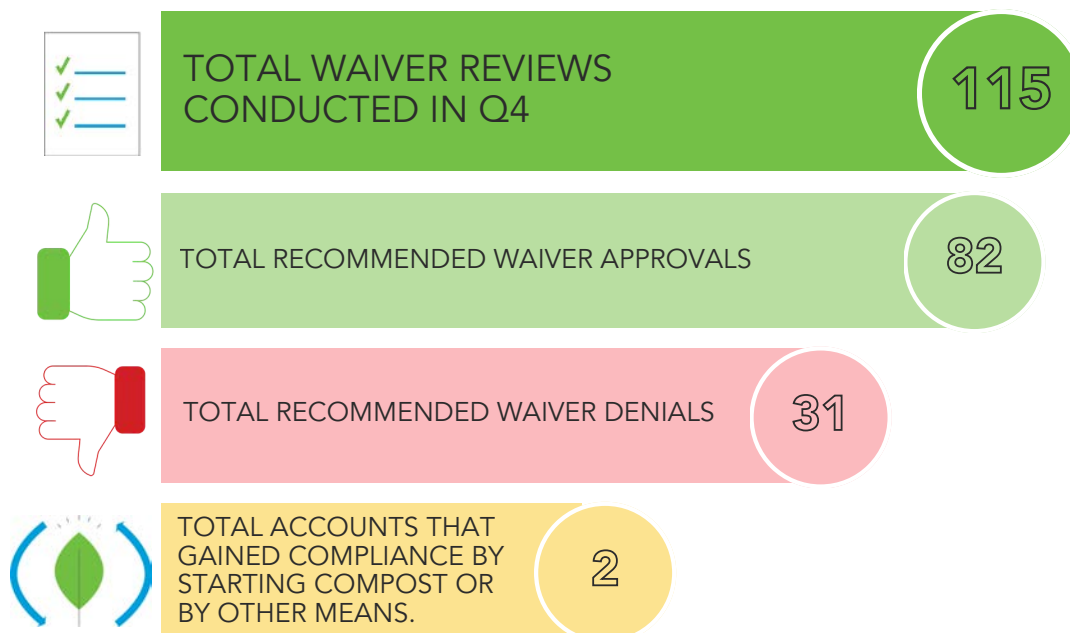
SB 1383 legislation provides the opportunity for accounts that do not meet volume-specific thresholds or that have physical space limitations to apply for waivers, granting them exemption from organics implementations for five years upon approval. Recology Waste Zero supports the waiver review process by assessing each waiver application and providing recommendations to RethinkWaste as to whether the application should be approved or denied.

De minimis waiver requests involve on-site inspections and include a combination of utilizing current service level data, commercial classification codes, and the account history to analyze potential organic materials generated onsite.

Space limitation waiver requests involve on-site inspections and include a combination of utilizing current service level data, and adjusting current service levels to analyze if adequate space for a compost container is available. Additionally, guidance is provided on potential long-term solutions to accommodate the addition of recycle and organics container(s).

Applicants denied SB 1383 waivers receive continued technical assistance by Recology Waste Zero to support SB 1383 compliance.

In Q4 2025, Recology Waste Zero received **115** waiver requests. By the end of September, Recology Waste Zero provided **82** waiver approval recommendations and **31** waiver denial recommendations. **2** accounts that applied for waivers gained SB 1383 compliance by starting an organics program, sharing service with their neighbor, or backhauling their organic waste.

Recology hand-delivered a total of **1,916** resources to commercial businesses and multi-family dwelling residents during Q4 2025. This includes, and is not limited to, the delivery of Recycle Buddy Bags, kitchen pails, SB 1383 doorhangers, program signage, internal containers, and battery buckets. Further detail is outlined in Table 1 in page 47.

Recology Waste Zero delivers educational presentations in classrooms, leads hands-on training for restaurant and janitorial staff, and facilitates discussions in office environments. These services may include recycling games, waste sorting demonstrations, and more formal presentations discussing resource recovery and waste reduction.

Additionally, Recology participated in a total of **27** community tabling events, trainings, and presentations, connecting with approximately **952** community members.

Professional Development

Recology South Valley Organics Facility Tour

On October 27th, Recology Waste Zero had the opportunity to tour Recology's South Valley Organics facility in Gilroy, one of Recology's eight composting facilities. Hosted by General Manager Mike Kelly and Regional Environmental Manager Chris Gibson, the team learned about different types of large-scale commercial composting, such as windrow composting and aerated static pile composting. The team also learned about challenges faced in an large-scale commercial composting operation, such as plastic contamination and water management. The team learned that heavily-contaminated organics material cannot be used as compost and must be used for other purposes instead.



This was an incredible opportunity for the Waste Zero team to tour a Recology composting facility and have their questions about organics composting answered. The team will be able to utilize their new knowledge to educate community members on the importance of keeping organic waste free of contamination and composting to reduce short-lived climate pollutants in the landfill.

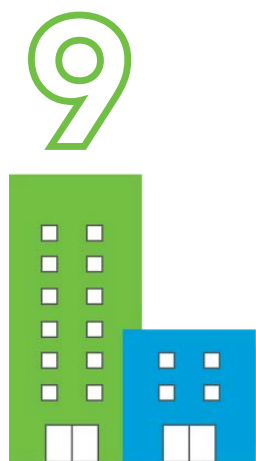


New Development Enclosures & Plan Review

Recology Waste Zero, in collaboration with Recology’s Operations Team, coordinate consultations with developers, architects, and third-party trash management vendors to implement resource recovery management plans. All stakeholders review enclosure specifications and project blueprints to facilitate source reduction systems and recovery plans that result in higher quality materials collected. Each proposed project is required to complete a detailed questionnaire from Recology. This questionnaire is then utilized in determining appropriate service levels and effective container placement for customer access as well as safe serviceability.

To support State-mandated recycling efforts to improve diversion, Recology Waste Zero advocates for building designs that facilitate ease and accessibility of resource recovery receptacles while minimizing collection frequencies for environmental quality and operational efficiency improvement.

In Q4, 9 new development projects were approved by Recology San Mateo County. Recology San Mateo County’s Approval Letter does not guarantee final approval by the respective jurisdiction in which the project is being constructed.

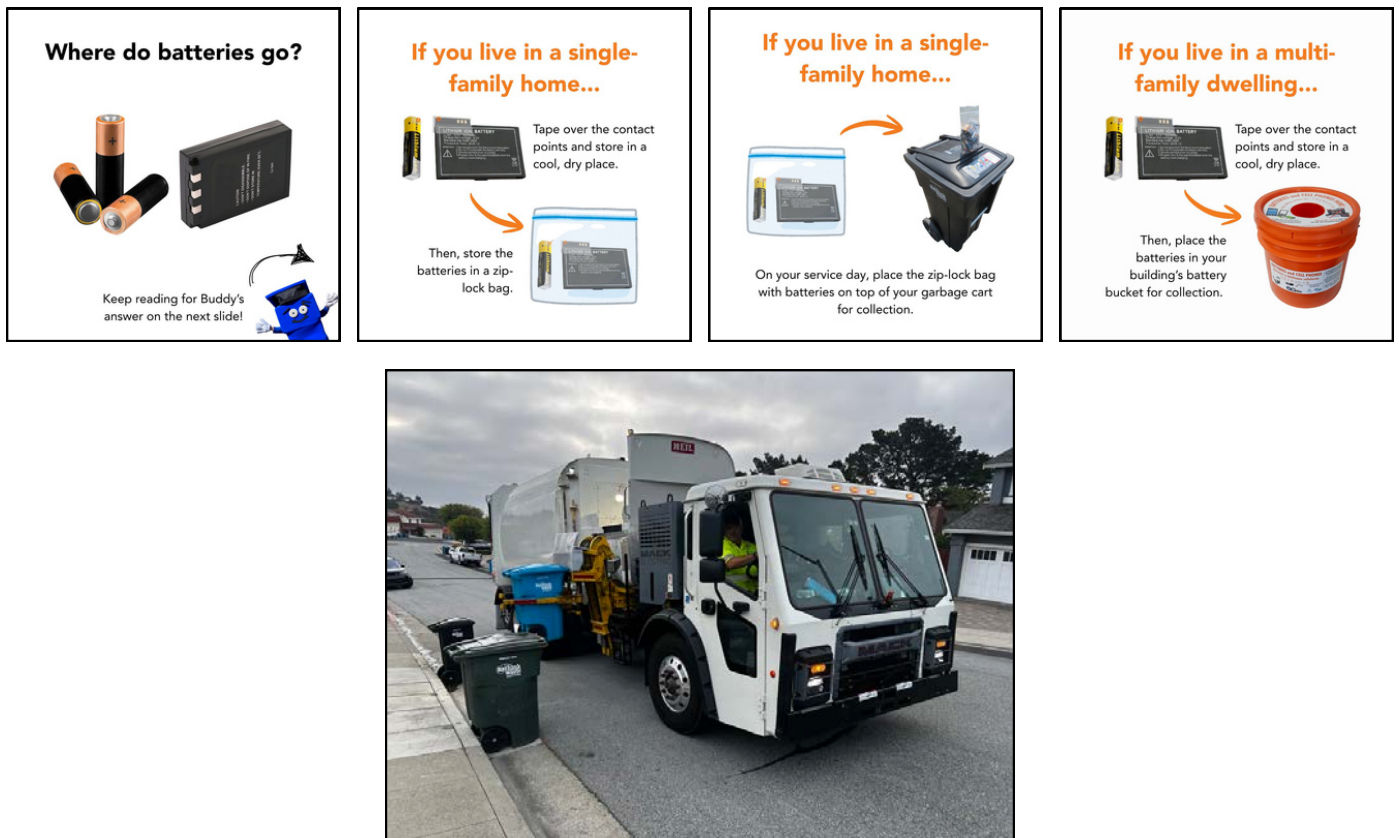

Social Media Community Engagement

Recology Waste Zero effectively utilizes multiple social media platforms including Facebook, Instagram, YouTube, and X to enhance outreach within the RethinkWaste service area. Our strategic use of these channels focuses on delivering important service updates, promoting best waste management practices, and fostering community engagement.

In Q4 2025, we focused our social media content on proper sorting practices and environmental awareness celebrations.
