FREE SHOREWAY ENVIRONMENTAL CENTER TOUR PROGRAM KICKS OFF FOR NEW SCHOOL YEAR
Busing Available for 3rd through 5th Grade Classes in RethinkWaste Service Area

SAN CARLOS, CA – October 3, 2017 – RethinkWaste has kicked off this school year’s free tour program at the Shoreway Environmental Center in San Carlos. The School Groups Tour program seeks to engage students and increase their knowledge through active learning experiences that are connected to the California Common Core Connection Standards. Tour participants learn about the 4Rs (reduce, reuse, recycle and rot) and resource conservation, and have the unique opportunity to see firsthand what happens to garbage, recyclables and organics once they are picked up from their homes and businesses. Over 35,000 people have toured the Shoreway Facility since the tour program began in January 2012 for schools and the general public.

RethinkWaste is continuing to provide free bus transportation for third through fifth grade classes in the RethinkWaste service area. To note, bus transportation is not available on Wednesday afternoons. Tours for this school year are offered Monday through Friday through June 2018.

“We look forward to hosting students, teachers, chaperones and the public to the Shoreway Environmental Center. Our tour program is a great opportunity for our communities to learn quick tips on how to conserve and protect our environment,” said Faustina Mututa, RethinkWaste Environmental Education Programs Manager. “Our calendar is quickly filling up so teachers book your spot.”

The tour program has additional hands-on activities making the tour experience more interactive, fun and memorable. These activities include making a solar jitter bug, where your water comes from puzzle, worms, plant-a-seed and lots more!

The approximately two-hour tour includes visiting the Transfer Station, where garbage, food scraps and yard trimmings are handled; a state-of-art Materials Recovery Facility (MRF), where recyclables are processed; the Environmental Education Center, which includes museum-quality exhibits, reuse art and a talking robot; and more. It also includes pre- and post-tour lessons. In addition, the Environmental Education Center has a 10,000 gallon rainwater harvest tank and composting and gardening demonstration area, enabling students and visitors to take back tips on how to conserve water and maintain healthy sustainable gardens at school and at home.

In addition to the tours, RethinkWaste is continuing to offer its free Compost Giveaway Program for schools within its service area. Through the program, schools can receive up to five 50-pound bags of compost for a garden project, or up to 20 cubic yards of the material for landscaping projects per school year. The compost is made from the yard trimmings and food scraps set out by residents and businesses for collection in the green CartSMART and BizSMART containers.

The general public is also invited to visit Shoreway during its Public Open House Days, held the first and third Thursday of every month from 9:30 am – 10:30 am and 11:30 am – 12:30 pm.
