MFD Solid Waste – Franchised solid waste collected from multi-family dwellings coded as apartments delivered to the Shoreway Recycling and Disposal Center. Source data is inbound tonnage data provided to Recology by the operator of the Shoreway Recycling and Disposal Center.

MFD Organics – Franchised organic materials collected from multi-family dwellings coded as apartments delivered to the Shoreway Recycling and Disposal Center. Source data is inbound tonnage data provided to Recology by the operator of the Shoreway Recycling and Disposal Center.

Roll-Off Solid Waste – Franchised solid waste collected in drop boxes or compactors, serviced by drop box collection vehicles, delivered to the Shoreway Recycling and Disposal Center. Roll-Off Recycling – Franchised recyclable materials collected in drop boxes or compactors, serviced by drop box collection vehicles, delivered to the Shoreway Recycling and Disposal Center. Residential Recycling – Franchised recyclable materials collected from single-family dwellings delivered to the Shoreway Recycling and Disposal Center. Source data is inbound tonnage data provided to Recology by the operator of the Shoreway Recycling and Disposal Center.

Residential Organics – Franchised organic materials collected from single-family dwellings delivered to the Shoreway Recycling and Disposal Center. Source data is inbound tonnage data provided to Recology by the operator of the Shoreway Recycling and Disposal Center.

Tonnage Allocations – During Quarter 2, system tonnage allocations were updated as follows: effective April 8 for usual and customary service changes; effective April 21 due to changes in residential routes.

Bulky item collection tonnage is allocated based on the number of collection events for solid waste and on the basis of the number of items collected for recyclables. The allocation methodology is applied consistently each month.

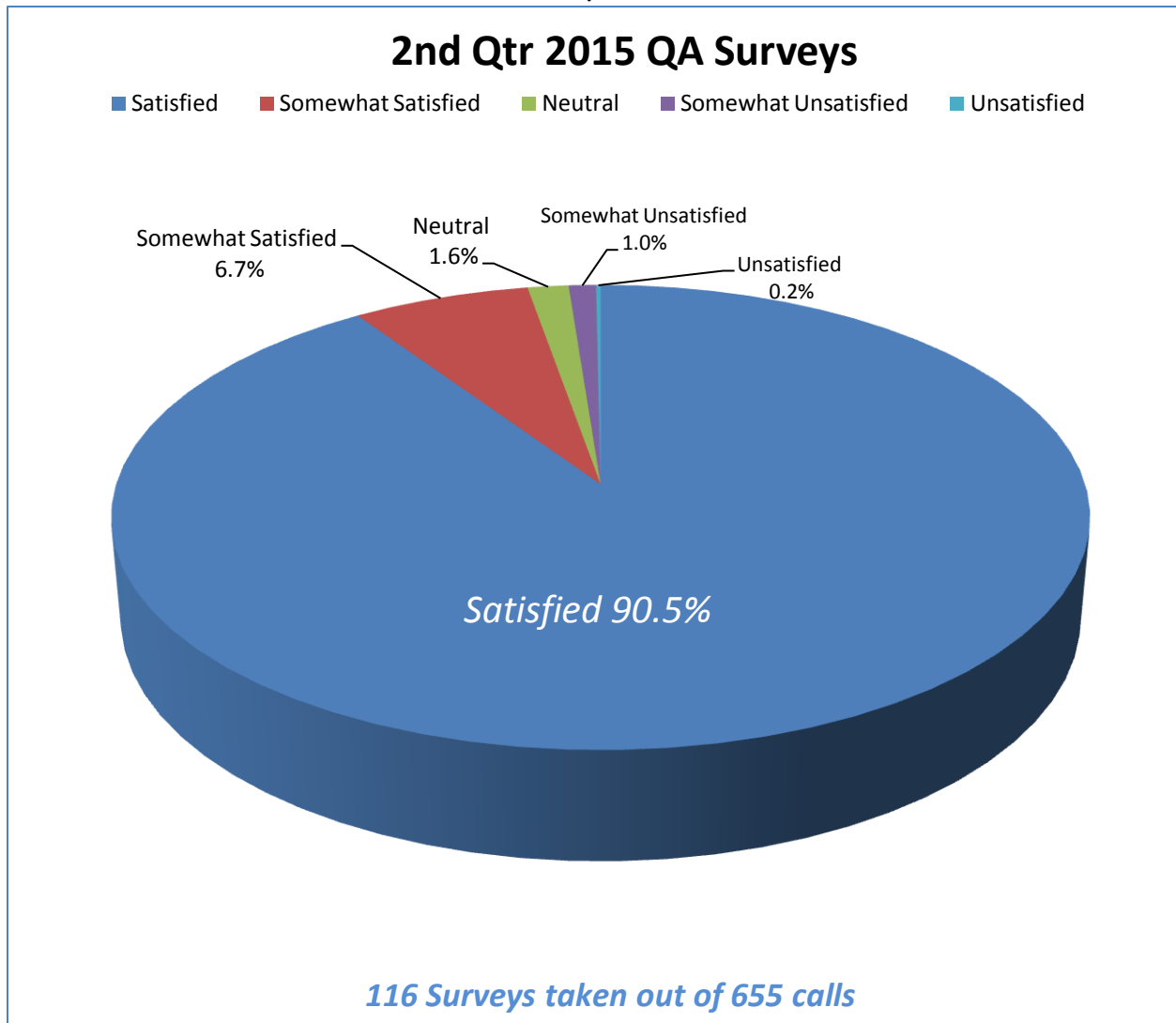


Customer Service Quality Assurance Surveys

J. COMMERCIAL RECYCLING PROMOTION PROGRAM STATUS REPORT

SUMMARY OF TRAINING AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES FOR THE COMMERCIAL DIVERSION TEAM AND SUPERVISORY STAFF

Below is a summary of the Quarter 2 (Q2) 2015 training and professional development activities for the Commercial Recycling Promotion Team (CRPT):

On May 19, 2015, Waste Zero Specialist Mia Rossi participated in the National Recycling Coalition Webinar *Striving for Zero Waste* at an Educational Institution and the Use of the ReDi Index® Program Assessment Tool. Topics included how a team from Penn State University addressed the daunting challenge of implementing a zero waste program and developed an internet-based tool to measure and assess the program's success and effectiveness.

On June 4, 2015, Waste Zero Specialist Angela Goebel graduated from the Recology Leadership Program. The mission of the Recology Academy is to enhance the understanding and practice of leadership and managerial skills in their employees. In addition to building her skill-set in these areas, Angela had an opportunity to learn more about Recology and what makes Recology successful.

On June 16, 2015, Waste Zero Specialist Gina Tretten graduated from the San Mateo Area Chamber Leadership Program. As part of her graduation, she gave a presentation on "Sustaining Agriculture in San Mateo County." Gina's presentation focused on raising awareness of the challenges that threaten our agriculture system in San Mateo County and how all of us can be part of the solution. One of the most impactful things we can do to support sustainable agriculture in our County is to buy local.

On June 16, 2015, Waste Zero Specialists Angela Goebel, Anthony Guerra, and Sarah Prescott participated in Sustainable Materials Management Webinar Series on Vermicomposting. The speaker was Rhonda Sherman - Extension Specialist, Department of Biological and Agricultural Engineering, NC State University.

On June 24, 2015, Waste Zero Specialists Mia Rossi and Yvette Madera attended San Mateo County Pollution Prevention Program's (SMCWPPP) 2nd Annual Litter Roundtable Meeting. The 2nd annual meeting brought together the municipal staff and staff from their respective franchised waste haulers to develop efforts to reduce litter in their communities and comply with the Municipal Regional Stormwater Permit.

A DESCRIPTION OF THE STRATEGY AND OVERALL APPROACH TO ATTRACT AND RETAIN A HIGH QUALITY AND EFFECTIVE COMMERCIAL RECYCLING PROMOTION PROGRAM AND SUPERVISORY STAFF

Recology is recognized in the industry for its environmental commitments, programs, and services. We utilize our well-established networks to recruit the best-suited members for our

diversion teams by posting on specific “green industry” LISTSERVs that target individuals in the field of waste reduction. We support growth and leadership development amongst our employees and encourage educational opportunities both internally and externally.

At Recology, we believe an employee's compensation includes more than just their paychecks; we recognize that providing a comprehensive benefits package is an important aspect of our employees’ total compensation. By providing a competitive benefits package that includes Recology’s Employee Stock Ownership Plan (ESOP), Recology is able to attract and retain highly qualified employees.

A DESCRIPTION AND STATUS OF MEETING THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES FOR THE COMMERCIAL RECYCLING PROMOTION TEAM AND HOW THESE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES ARE TIED TO THE COMPENSATION INCENTIVE PLAN.

Our goals are to continue to recruit new recycling and compost customers and enhance the existing diversion programs, in order to increase the volume of recyclable and compostable materials collected and delivered to the Shoreway Environmental Center. The following is an update on the goals and objectives achieved in Q2 2015.

Target MFD with Low Diversion

The CRPT contacted 86 MFD customers during Q2 2015 with a 40% or below diversion rate. The CRPT was able to determine opportunities to reduce waste and assist the customers with increasing diversion levels during on-site visits and/or Site Assessments. The CRPT established communication with these customers to offer cost savings analyses, on-site technical assistance and/or provide customized educational pieces that best fit their needs.

Of the 86 MFD customers contacted, 12 implemented recycling service and 7 increased recycling service. Additionally, 4 customers were able to decrease garbage services by diverting materials out of their waste stream. The CRPT also delivered Recycling Buddy Bags to 9 MFDs.

New Compost Customers

Recology San Mateo County (RSMC) is pleased to report that the CRPT exceeded the Q2 2015 goal of recruiting or increasing new compost and/or recycling services in the commercial and MFD sectors as noted below:

‡The Mandatory Commercial Organics Recycling Assembly Bill (AB 1826) requires that businesses recycle their organic waste on and after April 1, 2016, depending on the amount of waste they generate per week. The law phases in the requirements on businesses, including multifamily residential dwellings that consist of five or more units (multifamily dwellings are not required to have a food waste diversion program), over time based on the amount and type of waste the business produces on a weekly basis, with full implementation realized in 2019. By January 1, 2016, local jurisdictions must have an organic waste recycling program in place. Jurisdictions must conduct outreach, education to inform businesses how to recycle organic waste in the jurisdiction, and monitoring to identify those not recycling and inform them of the law and how to recycle organic waste. By April 1, 2016, businesses that generate eight cubic yards of organic waste per week must arrange for organic waste recycling services.

Quarter 3 (Q3) 2015 Goals

RSMC’s goal is to continue to increase diversion by implementing new recycling and compost programs and to work directly with customers to maximize their existing programs. RSMC will continue to perform Site Assessments, conduct Site Checks to verify service levels and program efficiencies, and provide technical assistance to customers on a requested or as needed basis.

With that in mind, the following goals have been set for the CRPT:

- Implement new starts for commercial recycling and compost service to increase diversion
- Perform Site Assessments of Target Accounts
- Conduct Site Checks for verification of on-site collection containers at MFD and/or Commercial accounts
- Contact and schedule on site visits with food service accounts that will fall under AB1826 in 2016

The Q3 2015 goals for the CRPT will be achieved through the metrics outlined below:

- Conduct 150 Target Account Site Assessments for Commercial and/or MFD accounts
- Conduct 350 Site Checks for Commercial and/or MFD accounts
- Contact and schedule an onsite visit to 16 Commercial food service customers that generate 8yds or more of MSW per week to introduce requirements of AB1826
- Recruit or increase a minimum of 150 recycling and/or compost accounts

Compensation Incentive Plan

The CRPT does not have a compensation incentive plan for achieving set goals. However, Recology management conducts annual performance reviews to verify achievement of goals, as well as evaluate an employee's level of Recology's Leadership Competencies, which include items such as strategic thinking, business acumen, communications and customer relations. The annual performance review is then used to determine potential merit increases.

A DESCRIPTION OF CONTRACTOR'S SALES STRATEGY FOR MAINTAINING AND/OR EXPANDING THE EXISTING COMMERCIAL RECYCLING ACCOUNT BASE AND DIVERSION LEVELS

To support our goal of increasing diversion and minimizing contamination, our strategy will be to focus attention on low diversion MFDs and compost rich accounts, to ensure their needs are being met and that maximum diversion is being achieved. The CRPT will continue to perform Site Checks to identify the needs of customers and areas in which we can improve existing diversion programs or implement new diversion services. An outline of these strategies and the accomplishments achieved in Q1 2015 is noted below:

Target Compost Rich Accounts for Assembly Bill 1826

On and after April 1, 2016, AB1826 will go into effect and require businesses that generate eight cubic yards or more of organic waste per week to arrange for organic waste services. The volume requirements of AB1826 will gradually decrease each year until the minimum requirement is businesses generating 2 or more cubic yards of organic waste in 2020.

In Q2 2015, the CRPT targeted organic rich accounts that had only garbage and/or garbage and recycling service with the goal of implementing compost service. During Q2 2015, the CRPT started 50 new compost accounts.

With this in mind, the CRPT will target accounts that fall under this law next year. The CRPT will initiate contact and schedule an onsite visit with 16 of the Food Service Sector that do not have organics collection service and generate 8 yards or more of garbage per week. The CRPT will inform these customers about AB1826, and will encourage the customers to start compost service so that they will be in compliance with the impending mandate.

The CRPT will offer technical assistance such as waste audits, cost savings analyses, trainings, educational materials, and internal containers to assist new compost accounts to have a successful implementation of new services.

Maintenance of High Traffic Commercial Business Districts

In Q3 2015, the CRPT will target high traffic commercial accounts, such as strip malls or condensed business districts for a door-to-door education campaign. The CRPT will have direct communication with customers and provide tailored educational pieces regarding contamination, service level recommendations and other service needs.

Presentations, Trainings and Outreach Materials

The CRPT utilizes presentations, trainings, public education and outreach materials to educate customers on the programs and services that RSMC offers. They are excellent tools to teach customers about how to properly separate items into the recycling, compost and garbage containers. The CRPT will continue to promote these services and materials in Q3 2015 to increase diversion and reduce contamination.

Services provided by RSMC to our Commercial and Agency Facility sectors include Single-Stream Recycling, Compost and Solid Waste Material collection. Support services provided include conducting Site Assessments and Site Checks, determining adequate and most cost

effective service levels, providing presentations and trainings, and distributing public education materials and internal containers.
